Internship Project Description: This position assists ELEC Executive and Deputy Executive Directors with research projects aimed at informing policy-makers, the media and the public about campaign finance and lobbying trends. The specific projects vary depending on the needs of the agency at the time of the internship (i.e.- type of election year, such as gubernatorial or legislative). All projects involve research, writing and compilation of spreadsheets.
