

MINUTES OF THE COMMISSION MEETING

October 17, 1973

- A. We will undertake a 24-hour effort on October 30, 1973. This effort will necessitate retaining Ream and other Arthur Young people, in order to break the staff and consultants into night shift and day shift operators.
- B. Prior to the first two hearings which are scheduled for October 26, 1973, Farrell will supply guidelines to Goldman and Sheehan.
- C. Further discussion of penalties, etc., for late filing. A universal grace period through October 16, 1973, at 5 pm has been granted. Those filing after 5 p.m., October 16, will receive a letter of non-filing.

There will be no further forgiveness of the need for timely filing, and leniency will not be carried forward to the next filing date. Those candidates failing to respond by October 23, will receive subpoenas calling for an appearance on October 29, at which time the Commission will deal with each case on its own merits. Those hearings will be public, and I should do a press release.

- D. A discussion of regulations took place, and it was decided that regulations will not be issued until after the election, when the experience of the election and the filing will be of assistance. It will also be possible at that time to hold hearings.
- E. Supplemental Appropriation Discussion. We will put this together next week with Panelli.
