#### PUBLIC SESSION MINUTES

#### TELEPHONE CONFERENCE

APRIL 27, 1993

Chairman McNany, Commissioner Linett, Commissioner Eldridge, senior staff, and Director of Public Financing Nedda Massar participated in the telephone conference. Counsel Farrell was absent.

Chairman McNany called the meeting to order and announced that pursuant to the "Open Public Meetings Act," N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et seq., special notice of the meeting of the Commission had been filed with the Secretary of State's Office and distributed to the entire State House Press Corps.

The meeting convened by telephone at 10:00 a.m. at the Commission offices, Trenton, New Jersey.

#### 1. Public Matching Funds Funds

##### Candidate Jim Wallwork/Submission 2

An amount of \$20,696.89 was submitted for public matching funds by Candidate Jim Wallwork on April 19, 1993. Following a complete staff review of the submission, a net amount of \$18,246.99 in contributions was deemed eligible for match at a 2:1 ratio. The review determined that 15 contribution items submitted for match equalled an ineligibility rate of 14.15 percent.

Based on the net amount of \$18,246.99 determined to be eligible for match at a 2:1 ratio, staff recommended certification of \$36,493.98 in 1993 primary election public matching funds to Candidate Jim Wallwork.

On a motion by Commissioner Eldridge, seconded by Commissioner Linett and passed by a vote of 3-0, the Commission certified a total of \$36,493.98 in public matching funds to Candidate Wallwork.

2. Adjournment

On a motion by Commissioner Linett, seconded by Commissioner Eldridge and passed by a vote of 3-0, the Commission voted to adjourn at 10:03 a.m.
